



LEBANON

IOCC rebuilt 65 communities in southern Lebanon that had been badly damaged by last summer's war. Rebuilt schools and water systems have helped many communities – such as that of Suleiman – to recover and to move forward.



ETHIOPIA

"I have no shoes and my feet are bruised but I am determined to raise my child to be a responsible citizen."

When Saba learned she had the HIV virus, she feared the stigma and tried to hide from her neighbors. Fortunately, through IOCC's awareness and education program, Saba and her daughter are able to live openly and with dignity. IOCC's program has educated nearly 7 million Ethiopians in HIV/AIDS awareness and prevention.



"Before we were fisherman, but now we are learning a new skill of farming along with fishing in order to be able to support our families."

— Amir, Farmer Nias, Indonesia

Off the coast of Sumatra, Indonesia, fishermen like Amir who suffered from the devastation of the 2004 tsunami have been provided by IOCC with tools, seeds and equipment for their new lives as farmers. IOCC has also funded the building of new homes made with materials to guard against future earthquakes.

BOSNIA

"It was very hard to leave our home. It was very hard to be in exile."

— Dušan, Farmer Vrtoce, Bosnia-Herzegovina

Dušan's brother was killed in the Bosnian War and he and his parents were driven from their farm. But IOCC put a plan together to help displaced families return to their villages and rebuild their homes. With help from IOCC, including farming tools, food, and some small animals, Dušan and his parents became the first family to return to their village.
