SYRIA RESPONSE: Syria's spreading civil conflict is forcing thousands of Iraqi refugee families that had settled in Syria to flee again. Many are ending up back in Iraq. IOCC is responding to the Iraqi families at Domiz Refugee Camp in northern Iraq with the distribution of urgently needed

relief items. Since 2012, IOCC has assisted nearly 800,000 people displaced inside Syria or living as refugees.





USA: Members of the IOCC Frontline, a team of highly trained and experienced emergency response personnel who assist communities and Orthodox parishioners in times of crisis, were recently dispatched to central Oklahoma to assist survivors of a massive tornado, then later to Arizona, where nineteen firefighters died battling wildfires.

From regional offices spread across Syria, IOCC is one of only a few humanitarian agencies able to provide direct relief to families and elderly living in some of the most volatile areas with urgently needed assistance.

CRISIS COUNSELING



Many Syrians have witnessed unspeakable violence or endured extreme hardship during the civil war. IOCC is providing counseling to displaced Syrians and children suffering from depression or anxiety brought on by these traumatic experiences.

SHELTER



As the fighting continues to rage throughout the country, more families are being displaced, often several times. IOCC is responding by repairing and improving shelters or unfinished buildings in Syria to house as many displaced Syrians as possible.

FOOD



IOCC is distributing lifesaving food parcels to vulnerable families living far from their familiar neighborhoods and struggling to survive.

HEALTH & HYGIENE



IOCC is distributing kits filled with essential hygiene items to help keep children and their families healthy and protected from exposure to crowded or unsanitary surroundings.
