IOCC's mission continues to be extended to more people around the world.

This summer a needs assessment was completed in Bulgaria, an assessment team departed recently for Ethiopia, and another team is preparing to leave for India. A new IOCC office was opened earlier this year in Romania and work has advanced swiftly in that country. Long-term development projects are addressing entrenched poverty in the countries of Central and Eastern Europe and the Middle East. Recently approved major funding is enabling IOCC to continue and increase direly needed aid in the Russian Federation, the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia, and Bosnia-Herzegovina (Republika Srpska).

The commencement of IOCC's U.S. Program, added to everything else being done, brings Orthodoxy's humanitarian aid organization into a new and exciting generation of service to fellow man. This service is the direct result of the generosity and support of the Orthodox faithful throughout America, as well as our Orthodox parishes and their organizations.

Please be certain, father, that this growth in support from our people across the country is due in large part because of your efforts to bring the message of IOCC to the attention of the faithful. Awareness of IOCC as the humanitarian aid organization of the Orthodox Church is the cornerstone of our growth and progress over the past 8 years. ## Revised Lesson Plan Available

The IOCC lesson plan reported on in the last issue of Priest to Priest and used by a number of Orthodox Summer Camps has been revised for use with Sunday School youngsters. Based on the parable of the Good Samaritan, the lesson plan could be an excellent tool for educating our children about the concept of giving and about the mission of IOCC. Ideally, it could be used in Sunday School classrooms on IOCC Sunday, November 19th. The lesson plan is available on IOCC's web site (<a href="www.iocc.org">www.iocc.org</a>) for younger (Level 1) and older students (Level 2), with Teacher's Guides incorporated in the lesson plan. Discussions are currently being held to make the lesson plan a part of each Orthodox Church jurisdiction's Sunday School curriculum.

## IOCC Sunday, November 19th

As in past years, the venerable Hierarchs of the Standing Conference of Canonical Orthodox Bishops in the Americas (SCOBA), have declared the Sunday before Thanksgiving (November 19th) to be "IOCC Sunday" throughout the land. The parish priests of all Orthodox jurisdictions in America soon will receive a copy of the Archpastoral Encyclical issued by SCOBA, to be read in Church on November 19th following the Divine Liturgy.

With your help, father, the message of IOCC as conveyed by our Bishops will be brought before the Orthodox faithful across America on that day. Perhaps you can further enhance the effort by offering your own words of support following the reading of the SCOBA encyclical. IOCC Sunday is an excellent opportunity for the people worshipping together at the Divine Liturgy to make a contribution in support of IOCC's work among those in need throughout the world.

# MC Chairpersons to Meet

Twenty chairpersons of IOCC Metropolitan Committees across America will meet in Chicago, November 17-19. The agenda will encourage interactive discussion of ideas for accomplishing the work of committees in different metropolitan areas of the country. In addition to the chairpersons of about 6 metropolitan committees that have existed since the very first years of IOCC's existence, those committees established over the last 18 months will also be represented.

A highlight of the gathering will be the opportunity to interact with the members of IOCC's Board of Directors, who will be gathered at the same time for their Fall, 2000 meeting. On Sunday morning, November 19th (IOCC Sunday), the Metropolitan Committee Chairpersons and IOCC Board Members will worship together at the Holy Resurrection Serbian Orthodox Cathedral in Chicago.
